Catchie/dyking style has cutting edge parallel with shaft (approx 15"). Head weight approx 4lb. French style walling hammer has cutting edge parallel with shaft (approx 15"). Head weight approx 2½lb.

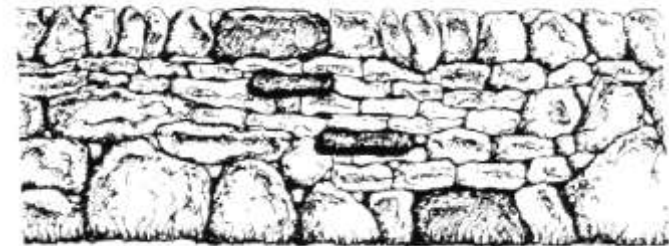
