Summary of Project

The structure consists of a raised platform with an upper chamber built on it. The chamber has two narrow circular mortared pillars to the front, which form a veranda framing views of the sea and the surrounding hills. The openings have unique ironwork as a guardrail which matches a full height lockable gate in the doorway. The wall opposite has a small stained glass window, below which is a stone bench. This is aligned to the veranda openings to provide a view of the nearby island. Each of the other openings frames a different aspect of the view. The structure has a corbelled domed roof topped with turf and a decorative cobbled pebble floor.
